

EXPLORING THE POWER OF BOOKS

We all know the power that books can harness, but how often do we recognise the need for diversity and inclusion in the books we have available for children?



Literature can educate, enrich and enable children and young people. "When books are within reach, a world of possibilities opens up. Books unlock new ideas. They help people think in new ways." (Bookaid 2024).





Books should reflect the society in which we live, they should empower, not disempower. Children's books should be representative of the culturally diverse world around us, and children should all be able to recognise themselves in some of the literature they access.

A study by the Centre for Literacy in Primary Education found that in 2021 the percentage of books published which include a main character who is from a minority ethnic background was only 9%. Within the same time period, 33.9% of children in Primary Education were from minority ethnic backgrounds.

Naomi & James Jones




Triangle doesn't roll like the circles, or stack like the squares. So she sets off to find some friends who are exactly like her. But when she finds the other triangles, there is still something missing.

MIXED


Arree Chung

Shola Oz


I Am Whole is based on a multi-racial family who bring together their languages, backgrounds, and cultures in the upbringing of their daughter.

Nicola Davies



WHAT IS A REFUGEE?


Elise Gravel

This book prompts children to think about what it may be like to be faced with war and the huge decisions it brings.



SOMETIMES I FEEL SUNNY



THE COLOUR MONSTER


Anna Llenas

A lift-the-flap book which is part of the 'first questions' series. The book follows frogs as they explore why they feel afraid, what fear feels like, and how to feel less scared.



MY MAGIC FAMILY


Lotte Jeffs




A brilliantly illustrated book which celebrates the diversity of families and highlights how families may change over time.

A great literary example of how families come in all different shapes and sizes. This book includes lone-parent, adoptive, foster, divorced, and step families as well as many others.



Leslea has published two brilliant board books featuring the loving bond between same-sex parents and their child.


TOPIC: LOSS AND LONELINESS

This book offers a space for conversation around the feelings of loss and how they may change moment to moment.






A fabulous representation of why we need one another in this world. This book explores friendship, love, and the need for community in order for us to thrive.


A WORLD FOR ME AND YOU

The author beautifully captures the feelings involved in not feeling seen. This is an important story about the need for community and truly seeing those around us,


ALL ARE WELCOME

A lovely picture book exploring the strength in diversity by following a group of children on a day at school and the power of friendship and welcome.




This joyful picture book encourages children to imagine the world as a vast library, with room on the shelves for everybody's story. It is a celebration of our incredibly diverse world.

A fantastic book which introduces the idea of different religions wearing different headwear. The author includes the names of the headwear in phonetic language to help children learn pronunciations.


Medeia inspires children to understand and respect different faiths and customs.

Thrity Umrigar


Binny shares the joy of Diwali and her family traditions with her classmates.

Thrity offers a lovely lesson on Diwali and the traditional food of jalebis and pedas.




THE KINDEST RED
